Other Places By Harold Pinter

One of the most influential playwrights of our century. Harold Pinter draws us into the psychological and intellectual world of absurdism through three one-act plays: Family Voices, a testament to the dysfunctional family; One for the Road, a maniacal interrogation of a man without a crime; and A Kind of Alaska, where a woman awakens to learn that she is no longer sixteen and that the world has changed around her. Director Kenneth Urban changes our world through his interpretation of these plays.

Wolf Lullaby By Hilary Bell

This touching and moving piece carries us to the far reaches of Australia. Director Nora Francescani introduces us to young Lizzie, a nine-year old kleptomaniac who exhibits some particularly disturbing tendencies. But when she is suspected of savagely murdering another schoolmate, we must wonder whether this child is capable of such horror. In a tremendously passionate outcry, author Hilary Bell takes us on an emotional roller coaster, taunting us with the knowledge that every parent's nightmare may come horribly true.

writer's workshop




